PTA DIRECTOR


Dalton is a PTA student at Wallace in Dothan, AL and counting down the last 10 months until graduation. He is also a certified personal trainer, CES, and HMS.

House of Delegates Updates

The House of Delegates is a pivotal policymaking body within the APTA. It consists of voting delegates from APTA chapters, sections/academies, and the PTA Council. Annually convened, the House deliberates on critical issues that impact the association and the physical therapy profession at large. It also plays a crucial role in electing national leaders, including the APTA Board of Directors and APTA Nominating Committee.



APTA Alabama Updates

Direct Access Win:

After many years of advocacy, we are excited to announce that Alabama has recently passed legislation granting direct access to physical therapy services! This significant milestone means that patients can now directly seek physical therapy care without needing a physician's referral, streamlining access to timely treatment.

APTA Award Recipients:

Congratulations to Rachel Thompson, DPT, UAB class of '23 for being awarded the 2024 Mary McMillan Scholarship Award and to Maya Turner, DPT, ASU class of '24 who received the APTA Minority Scholarship Fund. Throughout this year's sessions, the House of Delegates addressed a range of significant topics affecting our profession including recognizing physical therapists as practitioners of choice for rehabilitating individuals with vestibular-related balance disorders, promoting physical therapists as primary care and entrypoint providers, enhancing education on trauma-informed care, and investigating the prescriptive authority of physical therapists. The student council brought forth and passed a motion with 98% in the affirmative regarding the ethical and effective integration of artificial intelligence across physical therapist practice.
